TARGET 5 Ensure that the **use, harvesting and trade of wild species is sustainable, safe and legal**, preventing overexploitation, minimizing impacts on non-target species and ecosystems, and reducing the risk of pathogen spill-over, applying the ecosystem approach, while **respecting and protecting customary sustainable use by indigenous peoples and local communities**.

TARGET 9 Ensure that the **management and use of wild species are sustainable**, thereby providing social, economic and environmental benefits for people, especially those in vulnerable situations and those most dependent on biodiversity, including through **sustainable biodiversity-based activities, products and services** that enhance biodiversity, and protecting and encouraging customary sustainable use by indigenous peoples and local communities.

TARGET 10 Ensure that **areas under agriculture, aquaculture, fisheries and forestry are managed sustainably**, in particular through the sustainable use of biodiversity, including through a substantial increase of the application of **biodiversity friendly practices**, such as sustainable intensification, agroecological and other innovative approaches contributing to the resilience and long-term efficiency and productivity of these production systems and to food security, conserving and restoring biodiversity and maintaining nature's contributions to people, including ecosystem functions and services .

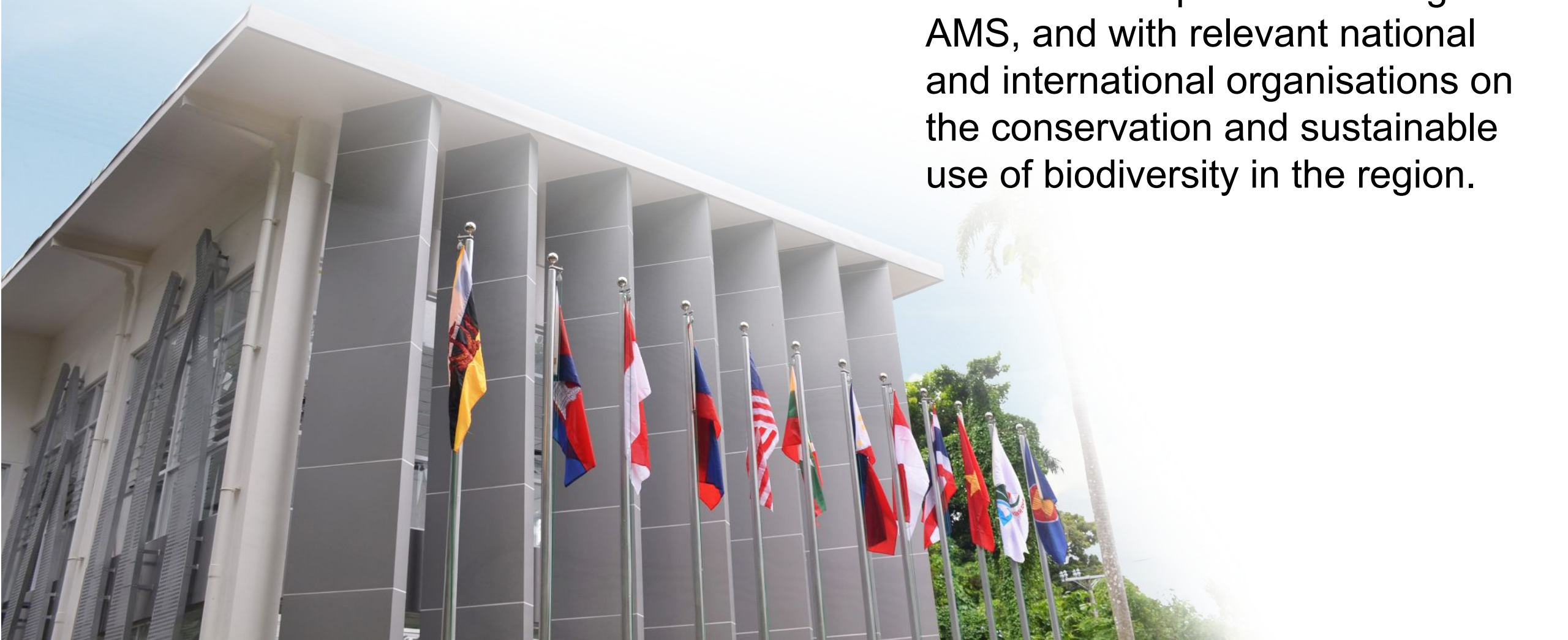
ASEAN Working Group on Nature Conservation and Biodiversity (AWGNCB)

- Facilitates cooperation among the AMS, and with relevant national and international organisations on the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity in the region.

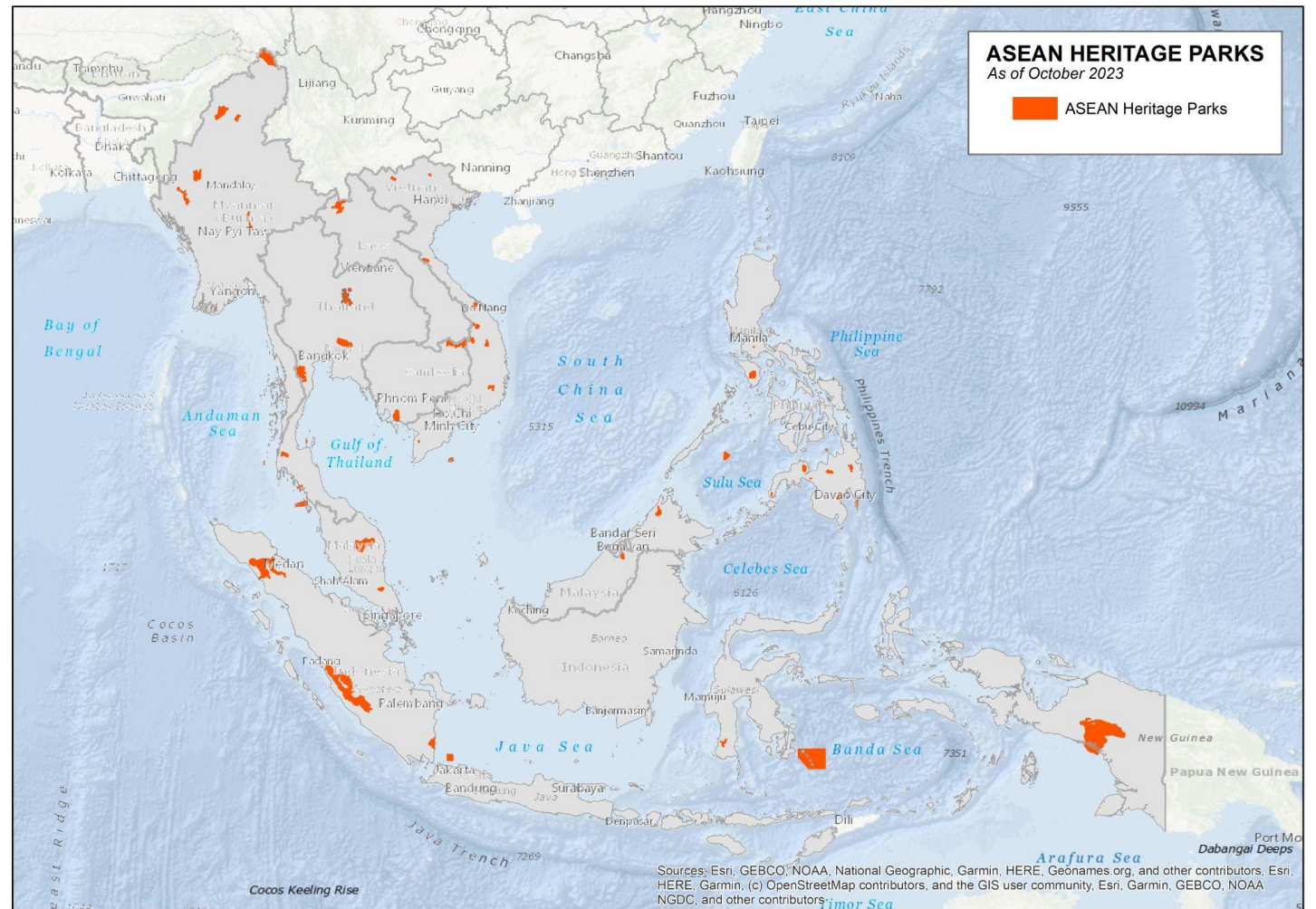




ASEAN Heritage Parks Programme

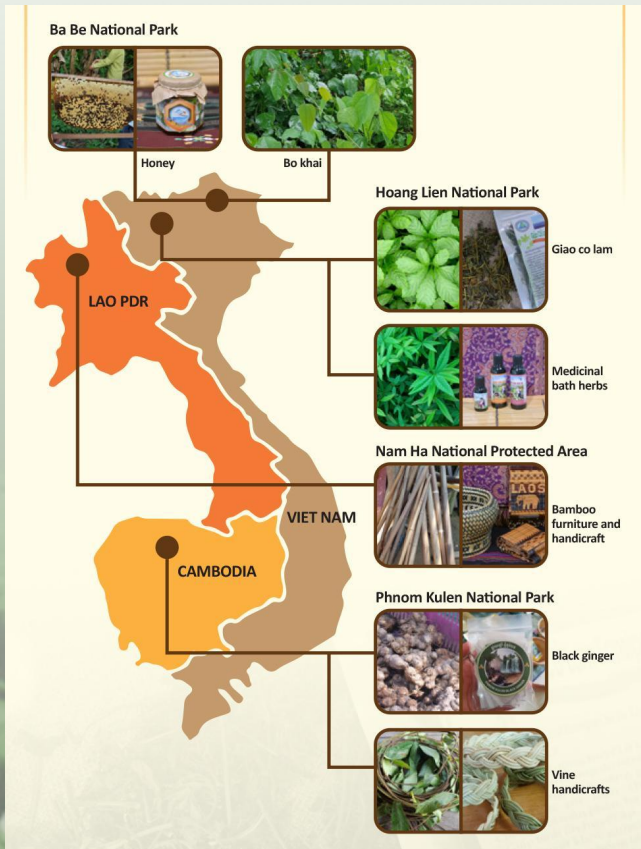

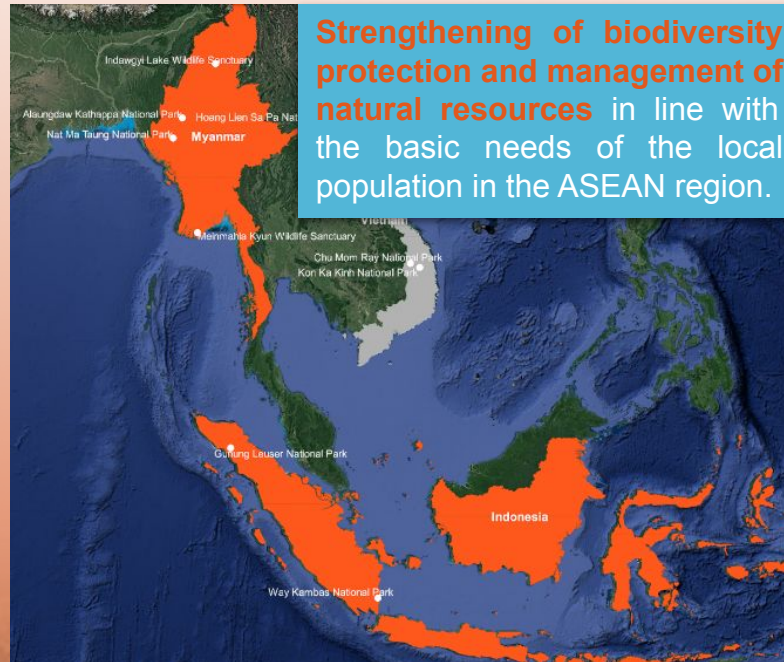

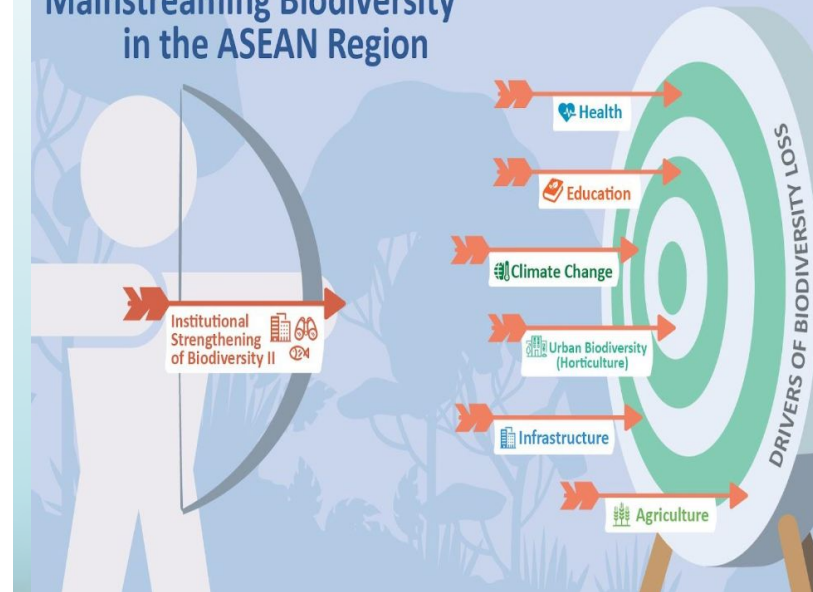

Small Grant Project: “Escalation of Honey Business Forest Farmers Group in Way Kambas National Park”

Beneficiary: Alas Kambas Cooperative, facilitated the formation of the cooperative, provision of honey production and packaging facilities, workshops for capacity building, marketing; product from klanceng bees

Microgrant Project: “Community Strengthening in an effort to increase income and preserve the Way Kambas National Park (WKNP) forest area”
Beneficiary: KTH Rabala One Jaya, financing for 15 setups of klanceng honeybee (*Trigona itama*) for the community honey beekeeping

Microgrant Project: “Development of a Cross-Stakeholder Elephant-Human Negative Interaction Mitigation Information System Integrated with Honeybee Cultivation Systems and Freshwater Fisheries in Rajabasa Lama I Village”

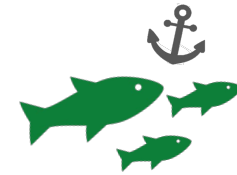

RBSAP development and support to NBSAP

Article 6 of the Convention on General Measures for Conservation and Sustainable Use states that each Party shall:

- (a) Develop national strategies, plans or programmes for the conservation and sustainable use of biological diversity or adapt for this purpose existing strategies, plans or programmes which shall reflect, inter alia, the measures set out in this Convention relevant to the Contracting Party concerned
- (b) Integrate, as far as possible and as appropriate, the conservation and sustainable use of biological diversity into relevant sectoral or cross-sectoral plans, programmes and policies.
